Notice of Southbound A38 works

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Early works for HS2 are carried out by a joint venture between Laing O'Rourke and Murphy & Sons known as LM.

We will be carrying out works.

We will be carrying out works on the Southbound A38 for a period of nine weeks from 11th October until 15th December. This work is required to allow for the connection of an access road. This will take vehicles working on the HS2 project off the Southbound A38 into a compound that is being created as part of the construction of the railway.

We need to operate traffic management.

On Friday overnight and Sunday overnight, a section of the A38 at Streethay will be closed. A signed diversion, highlighted on the map on the following page, will be in place and access to frontages will be maintained. There will be no closure on the weekend of Remembrance Sunday - November 10.

At other times:

- From Saturday morning to Sunday evening a single lane will be in operation in the area of the works
- At all other times, Monday morning to Friday evening, two narrow lanes will be in operation
- Speed restrictions will apply for the duration of the works

What we will do

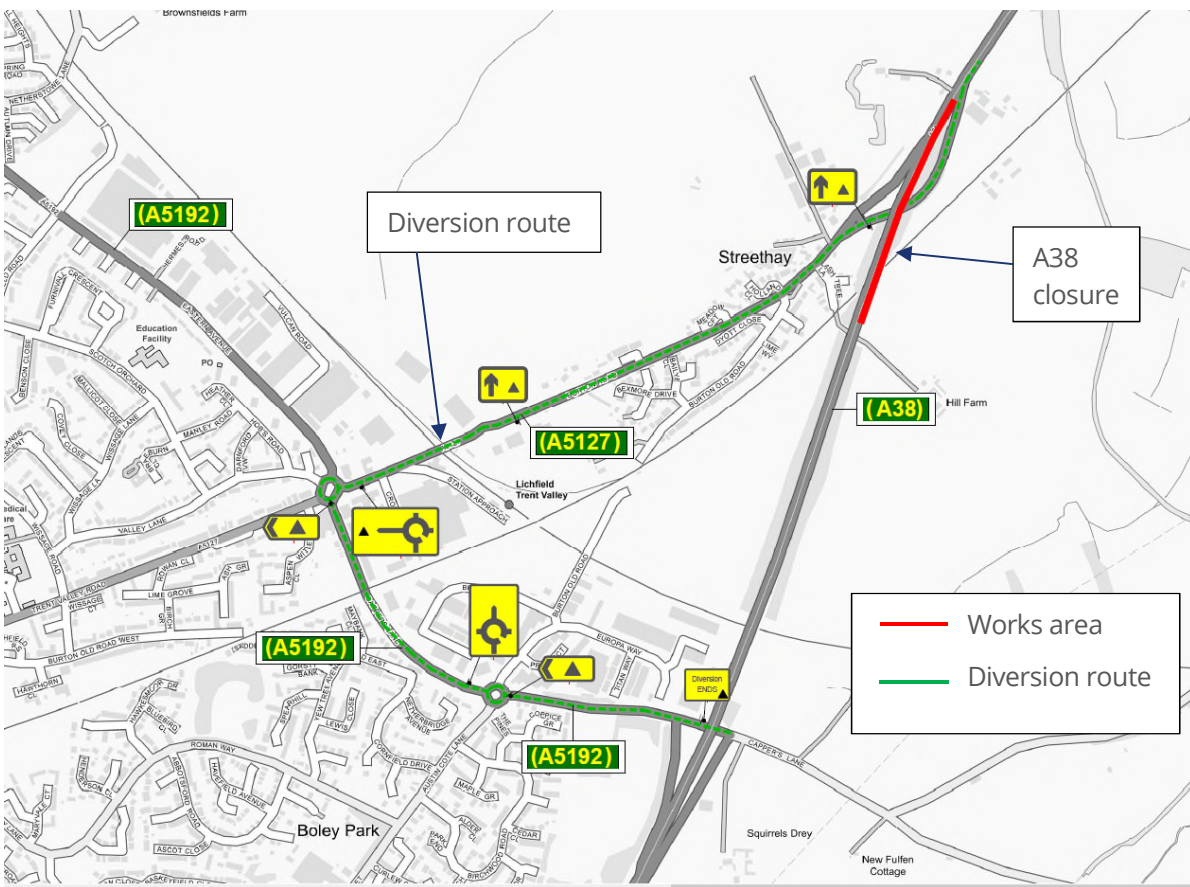
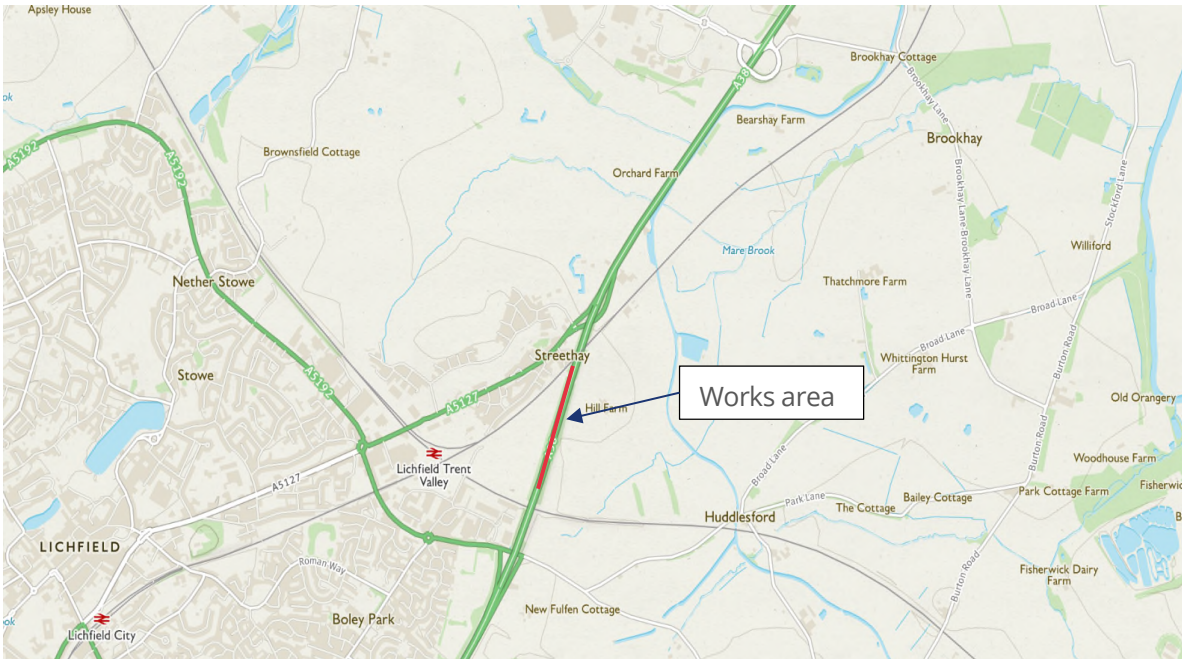
Keep all sites safe and secure.
